The AJFO Executive Committee is pleased to announce that we are **currently accepting applications for agencies interested in co-hosting** the next AJFO Conference to be held Fall 2023!

Since 1985, The Association for Justice-involved Females and Organizations (AJFO) Conference has cohosted a conference in an effort to educate correctional systems, programs and communities on how to effectively address accountability, competency development and the gender specific needs of women and girls who are involved in the criminal justice system.

Conference attendees represent a diverse array of corrections officers, practitioners, state administrators, policy makers, program directors, women with lived experience, advocates, researchers, and program developers. The conference has traditionally been attended by more than 500 professionals from federal, state and local correctional systems, as well as treatment providers and researchers from the United States, Canada and other countries. *This is the longest-running and one of the few national professional conference that is exclusively focused on women and girls involved with the justice system.* The goal is to provide professionals with resources that support women, strengthen families, and empower communities who are affected by the justice system.

The AJFO conference planning committee is co-chaired by the AJFO Planners, two board members tasked with oversight of conference planning and activities. The focus of the conference is to highlight research and advocacy efforts as they pertain to women and LGBT+ individuals involved in the criminal legal system within the United States. This conference will be the first of its kind utilizing an interdisciplinary approach to share research and collaborate on future research projects of understudied groups. Academics, students, advocates, and directly impacted communities will come together to raise awareness for the importance of transparent and accessible data for incarcerated women.

Regional Updates



Northeast – <u>Pennsylvania's</u> criminal justice community is all-in on the science behind positive and adverse childhood experiences and trauma-informed practice & policy.



Midwest – In <u>Illinios</u>, eighteen local grassroots organizations in Chicago's South Side are receiveing annual summer funding for their youth focused on a top priority of residents, trauma resiliency programming, highlighting violence prevention and trauma recovery.



Western – For the first time in its history, the <u>Hawaii</u> Youth Correctional Facility holds no incarcerated girls, due to reforms and community partnerships.



Southern – *Justice for Girls Blueprint: The Way Forward for <u>Florida</u>* was recently released by the Delores Barr Weaver Policy Center, a 5-year best-practice, girl-centered report that offers reform solutions and scores on the state's progress on implementing policy and practice changes.



International - The new Limerick women's prison, due to open in January 2023, will look unlike any other prison in <u>Ireland</u> – or England, for that matter.
